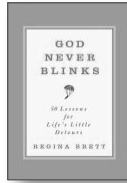
Meet Inspirational Best Selling Author Regina Brett

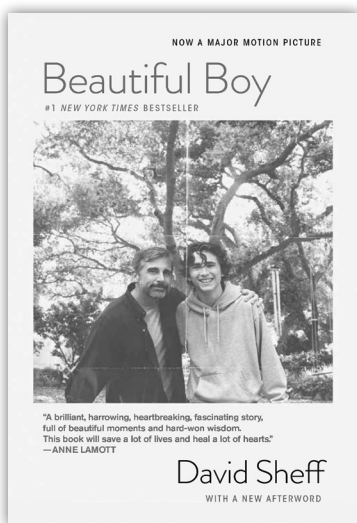
