Stark County District Library Foundation hosting Tap Into Literacy Fundraiser

October 9, 2015 (Canton, Ohio) – Stark County District Library Foundation is hosting an evening of great food and craft brews in support of Stark County District Library. Tap Into Literacy will be held on Thursday, October 29 from 6 -9pm at Canton Brewing Company in downtown Canton.

Tap Into Literacy is distinctly unlike other fundraisers, designed to introduce new friends to the Library's critical work in addition to raising funds.

Guests will enjoy a fun, casual evening in the unique setting of Canton Brewing Company's Speakeasy, located in the lower level of 120 3rd St. NW, Canton, OH 44702. The ticket price of \$50 per person includes heavy hors d'oeuvres and a cash bar will be available.

Throughout the evening, instead of a formal program guests will discover how the Library is reimagining itself as The Smart Store® by exploring several "Smart" stations showcasing unique Library offerings including 3D printing, the BikeSmart bike sharing network, and interactive family play spaces.

Likewise, there will be no auction, raffle, or other trappings of a traditional fundraiser. Rather, in keeping with the night's theme, guests will use a "guest check" to choose from a menu of Library services and resources that they can support with their donation.

Tap Into Literacy is being co-chaired by Ryan Fulmer of Beese Fulmer Private Wealth Management, Tony Lambos of Kendall House Inc. KFC, and Kyle Sheposh of Solmet Technologies, all members of Stark County District Library Foundation's Board of Directors. The Foundation is an independent nonprofit organization founded to raise funds in support of the Library and its staff in their mission to serve the citizens of Stark County.

The Foundation is chaired by Paula Mastroianni of Western Reserve PBS. Mastroianni is looking forward to the evening, "We have a great event planned for October 29. Library supporters will have a chance to see some of the new, innovative, and unique services that the Library offers in the relaxed setting of
