Stark County District Library Sandy Valley Branch hosting Book Sale

August 11, 2015 (Canton, OH) – The Sandy Valley Branch of Stark County District Library is hosting a book sale throughout the month of August. The sale began on August 10 and will run through August 29, 2015. Proceeds will benefit the Sandy Valley Branch Friends of the Library Group.

The book sale will run during library hours throughout the month of August. The Sandy Valley Branch is open Monday and Tuesday from 10am – 8pm, Wednesday through Friday from 10am-6pm, and Saturday from 10am-5pm. Items for sale will include fiction books, children’s books, like-new books, books on CD, DVDs, VHS tapes, CDs, magazines, and comic books. Pricing will range from \$0.50 cents per item to \$3 per item, depending on the type of item for sale. Bag days will take place on August 27, 28 and 29. During bag days, the first bag is \$3 and each additional bag is \$1.
